In Memorial: Judy Leach-Wolf 1949-2023



Our friend and colleague, Judy Wolf, passed away on June 25th 2023. Judy was a lot of things to many people. She was an avid genealogist, Master Gardener, and talented quilter. She enjoyed RV travel, sewing, 18th-century reenacting with the 5th NY Regiment for more than 10 years, Scouting, and fireworks. Judy lived two very busy and eventful lives. The first with her husband Billy, and the second with her partner, Jim Burr Sr. Always volunteering, be it with PTA, Girl or Boy Scouts, Cornell Cooperative Extension Master Gardeners, or tracking down a long passed relative; Judy was always busy. Through her genealogical research, she worked with Project Recover to research lost soldiers during World War 2 in Palau and bring them home to be buried. Here at the Brinckerhoff House, Judy was our lead gardener. She helped us expand our herb garden and kitchen vegetable garden and helped create, with a small team of volunteers,

several other areas of beautification on our grounds. She also shared her family with us, without whom we would not be able to present the living history programs that we currently offer. Judy, you are missed and loved by all you have touched. Bless you!

Churchill Visits East Fishkill by Rick Soedler

In June of 1942, Lt. Robert Morgenthau was on weekend leave from the US Navy and was greeted by a familiar guest of the homestead at Fishkill Farms. It was his father Henry Morgenthau Jr's. friend and President of the United States, Franklin Delano Roosevelt. At the time, Henry Morgenthau Jr. was Treasury Secretary under the FDR administration. Along with his wife, First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt, they brought along an unexpected guest. It was none other than British Prime Minister Winston Churchill. The photo to the right is a still shot taken from a home movie filmed that day. It shows Henry Morgenthau Jr. on the left chatting with Prime Minister Churchill on the right, outside the Morgenthau home on



East Hook Road. Also in attendance were Henry Morgenthau's wife Elinor Fatman-Morgenthau, Robert's wife Martha Partridge-Morgenthau, Robert's sister Joan Morgenthau, and one of Churchill's daughters. The purpose of the visit for the most part has been lost to history, but the home movie taken seems to show a social visit. Everyone in attendance was sitting outside the Morgenthau home on a beautiful summer's day drinking Mint Juleps. I'm sure that there was business discussed outside of the circle of family and visitors at some point that day. That has also been lost to history. Robert Morgenthau was quoted later in life saying that "Everyone enjoyed the mint juleps that day, except for Prime Minister Churchill, who preferred a glass of scotch to go with his cigar."
