From the Farmhouse by Site Director, Rick Soedler

Hello friends. We hope you are all well and that the winter wasn't too hard on you. Winters at the Brinckerhoff House can sometimes be mundane, however most of our usual projects were put on hold due to unforeseen maintenance issues. Several days before Christmas our 30+ year old furnace developed a crack in its heat exchanger. This could have created a dangerous situation but we were lucky to have caught it in time. After further inspection it was decided to replace the furnace with a new energy efficient unit. Thank you John Ossenkop and Sons. Then in February our hot water heater began to leak and had to be replaced. Thank you again to John Ossenkop and Sons. Our Committees have been busy scheduling events, school field trips, and maintaining the financial stability of the historical society. We thank all of our volunteers who help to make these things happen. Last fall we obtained a very generous Grant from Dutchess County. This coming season will see several improvements to our site. In addition to long overdue repairs that need to be done to several of our farmhouse chimneys, the John Hyatt blacksmiths shop will be having its forge rebuilt and will be getting a new brick chimney. The building will also be getting a new metal roof to replace the asphalt shingles. This will make the building much safer from sparks that could land on the roof and cause a fire. Our one room schoolhouse will also become ADA friendly and compliant with the installation of a new removable wheelchair ramp. We want to say thank you to Dutchess County, the town of East Fishkill and to all of you for your continued support.
